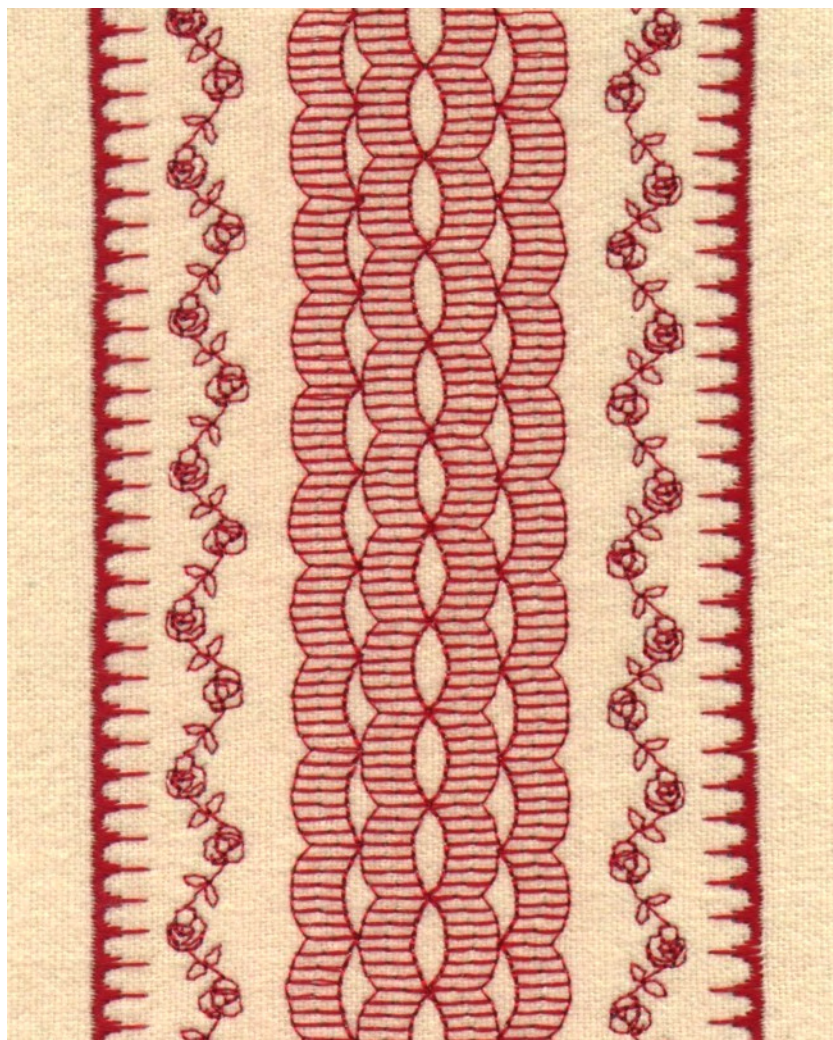


# BERNINA<sup>+</sup>

## Stacked Scallops

Many of the built-in stitches are beautiful in their own individual ways, but when combined with other stitches, the beauty expands and the creative potential is simply unlimited!

A simple method is used to create this combination by simply sewing the stitches in rows, side-by-side, in a "Stacked" manner. This type of stitch recipe is sewn from the center of the recipe out towards the edges on both the right and left sides.

Please note the **Stitching Order** as indicated under the picture.

7 5 3 1 2 4 6 8 ← **Stitching Order**



If your machine model does not have these exact stitches, select something similar **OR** refer to the *Stitch Conversion Chart* found in the *Stitch Recipe Exchange* area of the website.

### To Begin—

- ⇒ Attach Clear Foot #34/34C
- ⇒ Select Stitch #746 (scallop stitch)
- ⇒ Sew 4 rows as shown making use of Mirror Image functions (if available) and the markings on the presser foot.
- ⇒ On the outside edges of the "stacked" scallops, add a row of Stitch #147 (rose stitch)
- ⇒ Beyond the "rose" stitch, add Stitch #427 as the final "frame" to your creation
